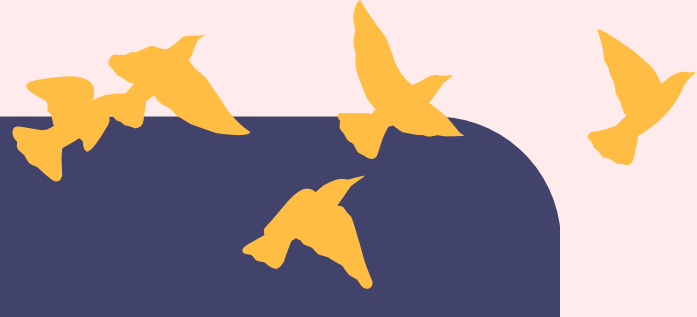
Trainers' Profile
